



#### **New Renter Protections**

Earlier this month the City Council approved two new ordinances in favor of renters. Now landlords with buildings that have three or more units need to give "just cause" for evictions. In addition, the mandatory mediation ordinance will require landlords to enter mediation if they increase the rent more than 5% within a 12-month period. The new ordinances mirror those in Fairfax, and as Mayor Phillips points out, this isn't rent control, but steps in the direction to give renters more rights. The decision was made after two contentious city council meetings earlier this year. Some argue that the city needs to address the issue by allowing more housing, others argue that these ordinances are necessary to support every income level in the San Rafael community.

#### **Sidewalks**

Update from City of San Rafael Sixty-eight properties signed up in Gerstle Park for the City of San Rafael's 2018 Sidewalk Program. Twenty-four of those locations have been completed as of 6/26/19.

Thomas Wong is the Project Manager for the City of San Rafael's Sidewalk Repair Program. Even though the sign up date for the 2019 program has expired, Thomas asks that we let residents know that those who may still want to join can and should reach out to Thomas directly at

# Fire Risk Advisory Committee Formed

As we all recall, the devastating fires from nearby Sonoma, Butte and Mendocino counties last year, caused death, destruction and immeasurable loss of life. The damage to the landscape is recovering after our wet winter but

most victims are still rebuilding their homes, if not living in trailers, RVs or with friends/ family. And though a large fire has not ravaged Marin County since 1923, we all remember the eerie red haze, unsafe levels of air contaminant, and ash on our cars. Kids couldn't play outside and many of us wore masks and kept our doors and windows closed. These conditions lasted two weeks in Marin, even though the

This new normal gave many of us pause to consider where will we go, what will we do and what do we pack? These questions should be asked and every household should have a plan with family and friends, in nearby communities to coordinate communication plans, travel plans and meeting places. But in addition to those logistics, there are important measures we can take today, to keep our homes, gardens and neighborhoods from further enraging a fire, should it choose to visit.

closest fires in Santa Rosa were 40 miles away.

To help engage communities across San Rafael, City officials have come together and developed the Wildfire Prevention and Protection Action Plan, which was adopted by the City Council in March. Now, there is a new committee, led by Mayor Gary Phillips, whose primary objective is to help City staff implement the Action Plan. The committee includes top city officials, and citizens, who will work together to review and amend the plan, as recommended. City staff include Quinn Gardner, Emergency Manager, Jim Schutz, City Manager, and citizens with emergency-related (previous or current) careers as well as neighborhood representatives. I'm proud to represent Gerstle Park.

The committee met on June 19th, to first develop a priority list of items, and will meet again in July. One of the first items we will discuss, is a proposed vegetation ordinance. Our goal is to put in place preventative measures and identify maintenance issues all neighborhoods can implement, to reduce our fire spread probability. We will need your help! You can expect updates and ideas to "harden," your home from fire risk, including the best building materials to use, which plants are less flammable and ways to keep your home safe from easy fire ignition. Little changes you make today, may mean the difference between coming home to find your home standing, or not. The Committee is taking into consideration our current resources, easily added or improved resources and low cost changes anyone can make. Stay tuned for more information on how you can help keep Gerstle Park safe.

## Whistlestop

There is no doubt about it. All of us are aging. We can't stop it, but we can try to do it gracefully. Thankfully, we have Whistlestop, a non-profit organization with this Mission Statement: Whistlestop believes we share a responsibility to ensure all Marin residents have an opportunity to age with dignity, independence and grace.

Tom and I joined Whistlestop a few years ago, after having lunch at Jackson Café (930 Tamalpais Ave), one of Whistlestop's services. It is across from the transit center downtown and open to the public M-F from 11:30am to 2:00pm. The food is very good, prepared by chefs and served by Whistlestop volunteers, and the price can't be beat--\$6.00 for members and \$10.00 for non-members. There is always a vegetarian option. You can sit at a small table or join one of the large community tables to meet new people and have lots of conversation. On the 1st Friday of each month there is a community-style breakfast 9-10am (\$3/\$6). Membership dues are \$20/rolling year with no age limit.

The café is only one of many services Whistlestop

offers. The Active Aging Center is in the same building and as you walk through you may see a Mahjongg game in progress, art and craft works for sale, people relaxing or reading. There are many classes offered at the center including Zumba, Tai Chi, line dancing, Ukulele, languages, computers, ESL, art, etc. Many are free. A Farmers Market truck visits there every Thursday 9-10am. Special events and workshops cover a variety of topics including Medicare, nutrition, scamming, understanding Alzheimer's. German, Persian, Russian and Spanish social groups meet there.

Extensive transportation services are available through Whistlestop, some with a fee and some free (provided by volunteers). Meal delivery services such as Meals on Wheels and Whistlestop Nourish are offered, too. Staff at Whistlestop can connect seniors with a wide range of social, legal, health, nutrition and support services. Those fortunate enough to not need these services (yet!) can participate as volunteers in many of Whistlestop's services.
