Neighborhood Beautification Update

We have been pondering a solution to the blight presented by the unmaintained planting strips bordering the park on San Rafael Avenue for some time — The mulch that the city has put in the past just washes out and clogs the gutters, and there is no infrastructure in place to irrigate plants in these areas. At a recent meeting with representatives from the city we finally came upon a solution that the city is excited about and so are we - bricks! The city is considering pouring new curbs for that street so that we could lay out a nice flat brick pattern. We hope to come to a conclusion on how to approach this by the end of August.

The Latest on 523 D Street (The Scary-looking House)

GPNA representatives continue to meet with the owner and the City Planning department to keep this project on track. (As some of you remember, Native American remains were discovered here during an earlier renovation attempt several years ago, which brought all work on the property to a standstill.) You probably have noticed that all the debris has been removed and the front of the building has been secured. It is hoped that by the time you get this newsletter screening will have been installed on the security fence and the rear of the structure will have been secured. GPNA members have expended quite a bit of effort to make sure that site clean-up became high priority of those involved in this difficult situation.

At this time the owner is planning to demolish the existing building and build a duplex or single family home. We will keep you posted on how this project is proceeding.

Volunteer to Clean Up San Rafael

The City of San Rafael Volunteer Program is once again sponsoring its fall cleanup day, this time expanded to the whole weekend of October 21 and 22. Bags, supplies and pickup will be offered by the city for volunteers to use to cleanup common areas in our neighborhoods. Have an area in mind? B Street? D Street? Short School? Gerstle Park? We will pick one or two areas in our neighborhood and set an early start time (9:00 a.m.?) for one or both days, depending on interest. Oak Tree Update:

In cooperation with Supervisor Hal Brown and the University of California Extension, the GPNA hosted an informational meeting on oak tree health and sudden oak death. Nichole Palkovsky, the county Oak Project Coordinator, gave a presentation at the Community Center on July 27th.

Of note were some clarifications on how to treat your oak trees. Contrary to our earlier understanding, the experts are cautioning against spraying healthy oak trees for the bark beetle, as it adds unnecessary toxins into the environment. Instead, you are asked to promote good oak tree health and not to water mature trees as it may promote fungus growth, which now appears to be a primary contributor to sudden oak death. The pathogen is now most likely believed to be a fungus of the genus *Phytophthora* (a relative of the fungus that caused the potato famine).

Check your oak trees regularly for the first symptoms of this disease. In coast live oak and black oaks, the earliest symptom is "bleeding" of a burgundy-red to tar-black thick sap on the bark surface. This may be present from the root collar (the area where the trunk fans out to the roots) up to six feet. In tanoaks, the first symptom to appear is usually yellowing leaves, and new growth may droop or turn brown. Bleeding is also seen, but usually later. Occasionally the fruiting bodies of the *Hypoxylon thouarsianum* fungus, which look like small black domes, may also be present.

If you find any of these symptoms indicating the tree is stressed, call a tree expert to confirm your findings and have the affected trees sprayed immediately with Astro. A diseased or stressed tree secretes a hormone which attracts bark beetles, which then come in and hasten the tree's death. The obvious sign of active beetles is a powdery sawdust in the trunk area. Spraying your tree at the beetle infestation stage may not prevent its death, but it may at least buy you some time.

If your tree does die, please attempt to prevent further transmission by covering the tree or stump with clear plastic. Another word of caution to prevent spreading this disease: When you have been in areas where you may be in contact with diseased trees, be careful not to spread the fungus through contact with contaminated soil by washing shoes, clothing, or tools.

Did You Know?

- Fences over six feet (6") shall be subject to environmental and design review, Chapter 14.25. A building permit is required for fences over six feet (6') in height.
- In residential districts, wire mesh, chain link and similar fences are prohibited within the front and street side yards.
- Alterations, additions, relocation, or replacement of existing, non-conforming fences must conform to current fence provisions. Ordinary maintenance and repairs may be made to keep a non-conforming fence in sound condition.
- Temporary security fences may be erected around construction sites during the time a valid building permit is in effect for construction on the premises. Temporary security fences need not comply with the above regulations and must be immediately removed upon completion of the construction authorized by the building permit. (Ord. 1663 -1 (part), 1994; Ord. 1625 - 1 (part), 1992).
